

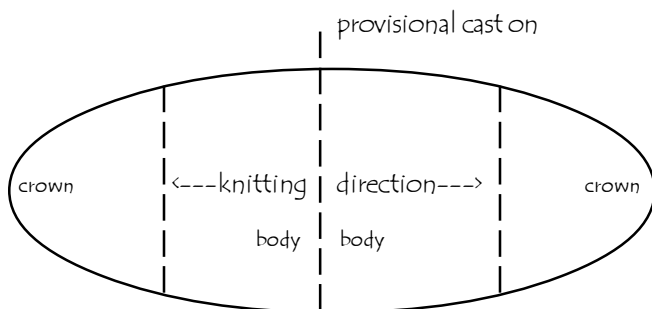
## doublemossa how to

circular knitting  
16" needle

## *a hat within a hat,*

twice as warm on top with  
4 layers of brim protection on the forehead

- 1 **pick your favorite stockinette hat pattern** (sport, dk and light worsted work best)  
cast on appropriate number of stitches listed AFTER the rib to body increase (not # of stitches for cuff)  
for total hat length, measure ear to ear over the top of the head you are knitting for,  
divide that number in half and add about 3" (for brim fold)
- 2 **begin with a provisional cast on** (with waste yarn, crochet chain cast-on, etc)
- 3 **make your all-stockinette hat, tie off top**
- 4 **go back to provisional cast on,**  
pick up live stitches as you remove waste yarn
- 5 **make "second" hat just like the other one, tie off the top**
- 6 **fold one hat inside the other, fold up brim, done!**



no pattern? hat size inches (circumference) and # to cast on:

sts/in	x inches		18"	19"	20"	21"	22"	23"
7	sts/in	cast on	126	134	140	148	154	162
6	sts/in	cast on	108	114	120	126	132	138
5.5	sts/in	cast on	100	105	110	116	120	126
5	sts/in	cast on	90	95	100	105	110	115

### NOTES -

You may have to adjust (INC or DEC) the number of stitches to a multiple of 12, 10, 8 etc before you start decreases,  
(the bigger the multiple, the rounder the crown)

SO figure out how many rows it will take to make the crown (based on the decrease multiple you choose)

After you knit 3 or 4 inches on the "first" hat, measure your row gauge (rows per inch).

Convert the total number of decrease rows to inches (e.g. 22 rows needed divided by 6.5 rows per inch = 3.38")

Subtract the inches from the total length of hat. 2 rows before body rows are completed, increase or decrease as necessary to reach your multiple, then begin decrease sequence rounds and finish the crown.

### EXAMPLES of DECREASE sequences

NOTE: decreases are made EVERY OTHER round (plain K round between decrease rounds)

multiple # DEC rnds begin with

12	22	[K10, K2tog] around, next DEC round [K9, K2tog] etc, until
10	18	[K8, k2tog] around, next DEC round [K7, K2tog] etc, until
8	14	[K6, K2tog] around, next DEC round [K5, K2tog] etc until



you complete [K2, K2tog],  
next round [K2, K2tog],  
draw yarn through, weave in ends
